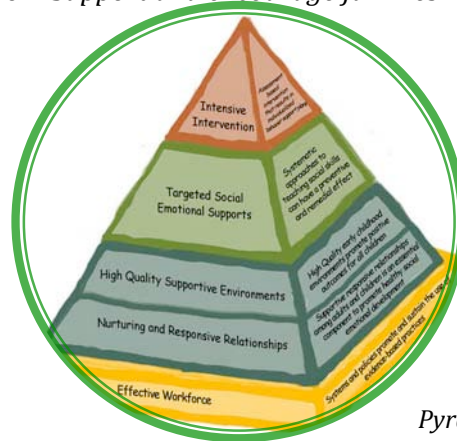
Social Emotional Fitness Strategic Plan 2010-2012

Increased number of supportive and nurturing environments that promote children's healthy social and emotional growth

- Supporting agencies in teaching families the importance of Social, Emotional, & Mental Health
- Teach developmentally appropriate activities

Pyramid Model

Identify number of environments, including early learning settings, providing early collaborating and supporting community consultation

- Increased number of opportunities (? agency or assist family efforts.)

Increased number of mental health services for children with persistent, serious challenging behaviors

- Continued distribution of an up-to-date referral resource tool
- Foster positive connections between agencies to agencies.
